INTRODUCTION

The academic professional program 035.01.02 Literary Creativity, originally approved by the Academic Council of Borys Grinchenko Kyiv University on 25.05.2017, minutes № 5, was reviewed after corrections, approved by the Academic Council of the Institute of Philology on 25.03.2019, minutes № 8 (order as of 25.04.2019, № 295), also, in view of the Standard for specialty 035 Philology for the second (master's) higher education level (Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine, order № 871as of 20.06.2019) and also due to some factors after the program implementation (its curriculum, subject syllabi and interships) throughout 2019-2020 academic year.

According to the Standard for specialty 035 Philology for the second (master's) higher education level the following chapters were added:

- General outline
- Graduate's competencies
- Program educational outcomes

While implementing the curriculum, during syllabi design, and receiving feedback from the graduates (meeting as of 16.12.2019, minutes №1) the working group for this major came the conclusion that professional competencies need improvement, in particular, GC-13, PC-9 – PC-17, PLO-J-5, PLO-J-6 are responsible for the program's unique features, implementing the mission and strategies of BGKU, and reflect the needs of the job-market for this major. Besides, minor changes involved the credits and hours ratio for different program's components to improve the logical flow: CSP-06, SCP-08 moved to Semester Two, optimized 4,5 credits of the Literary Studies Practice (pre-defense) in Semester Three into 3 credits for Semester Two, and 1,5 credits in Semester Three, accordingly.

The above-mentioned factors caused the design of this new version of the Program.
