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INTRODUCTION

Amendments to the 035.04.01 Ukrainian Language and Literature Academic Professional Program were caused by the need to coordinate its previous version, approved by the decision of the Academic Council as of 27.02.2017, minutes 4 (order 348 as of 26.05.2017), with a new Standard for Higher Education for specialty 035 Philology for the first (bachelor) level of higher education (Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine, order № 869 as of 20.06.2019), and also due to some factors after the program's implementation (its curriculum, subject syllabi and internships) throughout 2017-2018, 2018-2019, 2019-2020 academic years.

According to the Standard for Higher Education for specialty 035 Philology for the first (bachelor) level of higher education, the following parts of the curriculum were updated:

- Program general outline (specialty code and title, subject description);
- Graduate's competencies
- Program educational outcomes
- Graduates' attestation forms

While implementing the curriculum, designing syllabi, practicing in internships and final attestation the guarantor's group got feedback from professors, teachers, internship companies and employers' enterprises, expressing guidance for improvements and the Program optimization. After discussing them at meetings of different formats the team has authorized several alterations to the 035.01.01 Ukrainian Language and Literature Academic Professional Program. They involve several managerial specificities, which help achieve professional competencies, and are listed below:

- credit optimization for different academic components;
- semester final assessment;
- improved titles for academic subjects, to comply with their content.

In view of the above-mentioned factors the university adopted this updated version for the Academic Professional Program.

1. Attestation Exam in the major
2. Qualification Attestation Exam (CSP.10-12).
